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## Sinopsis

Violeta Rodríguez Fernández, an Eastern Asian Studies graduate, with the liveness of an enviable youth, investigates the influences of Japanese art in the European plastic disciplines at the end of the 19th and beginning of the 20th centuries, focusing on painting.
